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BUKIT ANTARABANGSA NATIONAL FIELD ARCHERY CHAMPIONSHIP 2025 20th -21st December 2025

TOURNAMENT INFORMATION (VER #2.0 - 121225)

1.0 Preamble

The **Bukit Antarabangsa National Field Archery Championship (NFAC@BA)** is a tournament sanctioned by **The National Archery Association of Malaysia (NAAM)** and the **Sports Commission of Malaysia (PJS)**. It is an effort to further develop and make available, a **World Archery (WA) compliant Field Archery event** in Malaysia and its neighbouring regions.

From the inaugural **Fraser's Hill National Field Archery Championship (FHiNFAC)** held in 2023, to the recently concluded **Fraser's Hill International Open Field Archery Competition (FHINoFAC 5-7 Dec 2025)** the discipline of Field Archery is fast gaining traction amongst the archery community, and this installment of **NFAC@BA** is aimed to further solidify its presence as a mainstream archery event in Malaysia and the region.

This event is expected to attract local and regional archers to put forth their skill, knowledge and endurance. The art and finesse needed to perform in Field Archery condition is said to be the epitome in the archer's development, attested by even the highest ranking archers globally. It is with this intent, the **Bukit Antarabangsa National Field Archery Championship** was developed to allow for the enhancement of the sport in Malaysia and the region.

2.0 The Competition Format

2.1 The WA Mixed Round, a format of competition is in compliance with the requirements stipulated in the **Rulebook of World Archery**. All distance windows, target types, numbers, timing as well as complexities will be audited by a team of professional Archery Judges with extensive event experience. This will ensure that any resultant achievements and records can be locally ratified. ***This event DOES NOT have any World Record Standings.***

2.2 Competition will utilize a course made up of 24 Target Check Points, a practice area with between 4 to 6 target lanes of varying distances, and a Medal Match Course made up of 4 Target Check Points.

2.3 Competition will comprise of Qualification Rounds & Elimination Rounds consisting of

- Session 1 comprising of ½ day of 12 CP Unmarked Distance targets of 3 arrow per target totalling 36 arrows
- Session 2 comprising of ½ day of 12 CP Marked Distance targets of 3 arrow per target totalling 36 arrows and
- Elimination Rounds & Medal Matches for
 - 1/8 rounds
 - 1/4 rounds
 - 1/2 rounds
 - Final Medal Matches rounds

2.5 Age determination is based on WA rules for all Junior and Master categories. An archer that has reached or exceeded the mandatory 50th Birthday on the year of the event (in this instance of the year 2025, those born on or before 1975) will compete as an OPEN SENIOR category. Archers can ONLY compete in ONE category (Masters 50+ Category is an automated category and there's no need to register as such), selected upon registration.

2.6 The rules enforced during this event is based upon the **Rulebook of World Archery** and any addendum to that from NAAM. Any and all discrepancies or challenges will be referred to the above rules and the decision of the Chief of Judges shall be final and non-contestable.

2.7 Fees Payable For This Event

NFAC is an Open National event and limited to a maximum of 256 participants. Fees payable are as follows:-

Registration via MAREOS

- All Categories RM150.00 per participant

International Archers - Individual Registration Via Organizers

- International Participants RM200.00 per participant

International archers will be provided with an official letter of invitation to allow for ease of visa and or entry requirements under sporting events.

Organizers reserve the right to reject any participation application without any explanation.



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3.0 The Competition Location

3.1 The competition will be held in the jurisdiction known as Bukit Antarabangsa, Ampang, Selangor. A 24 CP course will be designed and developed to allow for the competition to be executed. Location is located in an open and semi wooded location with undulating terrain giving a challenge to archers.

Participation will also include supplementary and supportive locations within the vicinity of Bukit Antarabangsa for purposes of group meetings, team managers’ meetings etc. The Team Managers meeting will also be conducted live via online platforms for those unable to make a physical attendance.

4.0 Participant Preparation

- 4.1 Apart from archery equipment, participants are required to be self-sustaining for their refreshment and sustenance needs.
- 4.2 Topical medication, sunblock, insect repellent and other relevant items are highly recommended.
- 4.3 Suitable clothing, spare clothing (if practical) and rain wear, windbreaker as well as suitable hats are also highly recommended. December is in the early to mid-Easterly Monsoon Season in Malaysia and rain , fog and strong winds may be a factor. Prepare for wet weather the best you can. As Bukit Antarabangsa is at an elevation of about 200m above sea level, the ambient temperature will be slightly lower than at sea level, so be prepared with suitable clothing.
- 4.4 It is highly recommended that archers utilize a suitable backpack to carry all essentials needed during the event. A sturdy small stool, Towels, wet wipes and other items needed are highly recommended.
- 4.5 Smoking and Consumption of alcoholic beverages during the event are strictly prohibited.
- 4.6 World Archery Anti-Doping rules are in full effect for the duration of the competition.

5.0 Low Carbon Foot Print and Minimization of Single Use Plastics

- 5.1 There will be an active ban for single use plastic bottles of below 1.0L (1000ml). It is highly suggested that participants utilize reusable bottles or use single use bottles of more than the 1000ml minimum limit. There will be water filling stations near the event site for filtered drinking water. Those wanting to consume isotonic, soft drinks etc. which are less than the 1000ml capacity will need to declare such items to the environment over-watch team. They will need to also declare the empty containers after completion of the day’s event. No littering will be tolerated throughout the event. There will be suitable waste receptacles at various locations on the course.
- 5.2 Carpooling is highly recommended to reduce the effective carbon footprint of the event. Public Transport is available via the Rapid On Demand App for last mile solution to the event vicinity.
